Objective & Features



Objective

The objective of the International Summer School is to educate students from East Asia and around the world about the politics, economy, and society of Korea, Japan, and China in order to examine ways to establish peace and co-prosperity by regional integration. Students will have opportunities to learn and discuss diverse ways for deepening integration in East Asia.

Participants are junior and senior undergraduate students or post-graduates from Korea, Japan, China and other parts of the world with a strong background in Political Science, International Relations, Economics, Business and Regional Studies.

Features of International Summer School

The Most Prestigious Asian Universities

The program is made up of lectures and workshops that will be offered respectively by professors and experts of Seoul National University, Korea, Waseda University, Japan and Peking University, China for three consecutive weeks. The first week of International Summer School will be held at Shanghai, China; the second week at Tokyo, Japan; the third week at Seoul, Korea.

Special Courses offered at the Hearts of Asia

The course agenda for each week will be divided into two parts. In the first half, students will be introduced to the politics and economy of the respective Asian nation in which they are studying. During the second half, students will learn about the principles of regional integration in Asia from the perspective of each country. A final wrap-up is prepared at the end of the summer school in Korea.

Wealth of Asian Traditional Lore

The Summer School will offer a unique setting for students to gather together and learn from each other as they satisfy their intellectual curiosities and explore historical and cultural values of each country. Excellent resources from the most prestigious universities in Asia will be made available to students, as they gain deeper mutual understanding with participating students from neighboring countries.

Field Trips

Field trips to political institutions and business firms make up the central pillar of the program. For instance, students visiting Seoul are scheduled to visit Samsung Electronics (or Hyundai Motors), in addition to customary cultural sites including the visit to the DMZ. Similar field trips are scheduled to take place in Shanghai and Tokyo.

Credits

Students who successfully complete the program are allowed to receive 3 credits from Seoul National University. Students are expected to take a total of 48 hours of course work, which consists of eight classes (2 hours each) for each of the 3 countries.

The faculty of the Summer School consists of famous scholars, businessmen, and politicians in Korea, Japan, and China along with other international experts on integration issues. The faculty will provide a wide range of lectures, seminars, and discussion sessions in each field.

Participating Universities

Graduate School of International Studies, Seoul National University

Seoul National University (SNU) is the nation's leading university, incomparable to any other private or public universities in Korea in its quality of education, students, and research, as well as in its influence on Korean society. SNU today is comprised of 16 colleges and five graduate schools, including the Graduate School of International Studies (GSIS). The main campus, Gwanak, occupies an area of 4.795 square km. SNU has a student enrollment of 32,000: 23,000 at the undergraduate level and 9,000 at the graduate level. Currently the university's 264,000 alumni are playing leading roles in every corner of the Korean society.

The Graduate School of International Studies (GSIS) was established on March 1, 1997 to offer multi-disciplinary education to its students and to train international and area specialists. The GSIS offers two-year postgraduate MA programs in the fields of international commerce, international cooperation, international area studies and Korean studies. All of these programs are conducted in English, further integrating GSIS as a natural academic hub for East Asia.

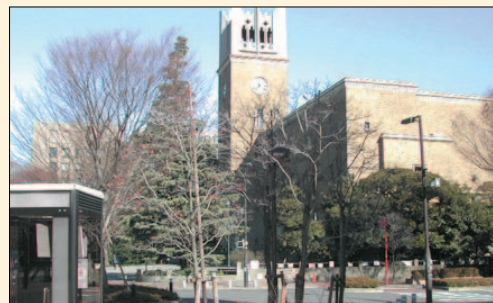

As a member of the Association of Professional Schools in International Affairs (APSIA), GSIS is well recognized abroad.



Graduate School of Asia-Pacific Studies, Waseda University

Founded in 1882, Waseda University is one of Japan's top private coeducational institutions of higher learning. Waseda University established the Waseda University Institute for Asia-Pacific Studies (WIAPS) in 1997 to build an educational network for the region and to serve as an international focal point for the advancement of learning on the Asia-Pacific region. The WIAPS became the launch pad for the establishment of the Graduate School of Asia-Pacific Studies (GSAPS) in April 1998, the first completely independent graduate school in the history of Waseda University. The founding principle of GSAPS is the use of an interdisciplinary, global, and local approach to analyze and understand the complex political, economic, industrial, managerial, social, and cultural dimensions of the Asia-Pacific region. GSAPS aims to educate professionals who possess a high level of specialized knowledge and those who will give back to the community, contributing to the current societal development.

GSAPS offers courses of study leading to both masters and doctoral degrees in two major fields of study: International Relations and International Management. Both major fields of study maintain their separate characteristics, but they complement and support each other to create an optimal learning and research environment.



School of Economics, Peking University

Peking University is a comprehensive and key national university, consisting of 30 colleges and 12 departments. The institution offers 93 specialties for undergraduates, two specialties for a second Bachelor's degree, 199 specialties for master's candidates, and 173 specialties for doctoral candidates.

The School of Economics is one of the most prominent economics research institutions in China, with a strong faculty made up of both distinguished senior scholars and a large number of young academic leaders. Currently, it has six academic departments, including the Department of Economics, the Department of International Economics and Trade, and the Department of Finance. The graduate program offers master's degrees in seven major fields and doctoral degrees in six fields. The school also has 12 research institutes and one post-doctoral research station, which was the first of its kind ever established in China. In 2005, the school had a total of over 8,000 students (including 119 foreign students).

The School of Economics aims at becoming one of the best economics institutions in Asia with worldwide influence. Led by the Dean, Professor Wei Liu, the school is actively expanding its key resources and working diligently to achieve its goals through research and teaching excellence.
