ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Fudan, Korea and Waseda international joint-research project is planned and conducted by graduate students. Its main goal is to provide students with a chance to experience the managing process of social survey, while learning the fundamentals of research and international cooperation.

Participants are required to work through the several stages of the survey, from choosing a research topic and developing the questionnaire, to presenting its results in an international workshop.

Our project started in 2002, at Chuo University. It moved to Waseda University and was conducted successfully in 2005, resulting in symposiums at Soochow University (Taipei). In 2006, partnership with Fudan University (Shanghai) and Yonsei University (Seoul) was established and the workshop was held in Shanghai. In 2007, Korea University has substituted Yonsei as the Korean partner. The projects also resulted in several academic presentations and publications.

This year's project inherited 2006's project title, "Comparative Sociological Approaches to Globalising East Asia", and aims at understanding the effects Globalisation has on the attitudes and values of youth in East Asia. For that purpose, each of the three teams collected and analysed the data for its country. The sample consisted of approximately 400 students from each university and totalled about 1200 samples. The questionnaire included items on national identification, social distance, media usage, work-values, exposure to foreign culture and degree of exposure to globalisation.

Our third workshop will be held in Waseda University and will feature presentations of Chinese, Korean and Japanese students on the results of the survey conducted in 2007.

For the future we plan to expand our horizons, including more partner countries and expanding our research target to include respondents other than students.
